## what this policy is about

Sometimes people need extra help when their behaviour puts them or others at risk  $\triangle$ .

A **Behaviour of concern** is actions that may hurt you or others a.

A restrictive practice is when someone's rights 🌼 or freedom

Restrictive practices can only be used:

- 🔽 As a last resort 🧶
- For the shortest time possible
- 🔽 With the right approvals 🍃

# X What is a restrictive practice?

Examples include:

- Locked doors
   or cupboards
- 🙋 Time-out 🏅 or seclusion 🚪
- † Holding someone to stop them moving
- Siving medicine state to control behaviour (not for health)

## Who helps with behaviour support?

A Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) Practitioner 🧣 :

- 🍴 Works with you and your team 🎥
- Q Looks at safe, positive ways to support behaviour

Writes a Behaviour Support Plan

## **K** What we do at Soaring Sparrows

- Oneck if a restrictive practice or behaviour of concern is happening
- Make sure you have funding for a PBS practitioner and help you apply for more funding if you need it .

- X While waiting for a PBS practitioner:

  - Record what happens in files
